Budget for 2016/17

The Parish Council agreed to raise the precept to £58,396. This equates to an extra £4.42 for the entire year for a band d property. The rise was unavoidable as prices are rising dramatically and the Parish Council did not want to cut any of the services that they provide.

The Council have secured a small grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund to fund the re-enactment as well as hold talks from a local historian at both schools for the pupils and another talk at Ashingdon and East Hawkwell Memorial Hall for residents. These talks will also take place in June 2016.

Neighbourhood Watch

During December 2015 and January 2016, Parish Councillors visited houses in the Ashingdon ward with a view to re-launching Neighbourhood Watch in the area.

Electoral Review of Rochford

Bus Shelters

Essex County Council has recently installed several brand new bus shelters in Ashingdon. New shelters can be found in Greensward Lane, opposite Canewdon Road and Ashingdon Road. All have two seats and an electricity supply so that real-time bus schedule displays can be fitted to tell passengers when the next bus is coming. All buses will constantly radio their location back to base and so the displays will give accurate arrival times.

Keeping Safe and secure

When it comes to strengthening your home security, an alarm system can firstly be used as a means of summoning help if somebody breaks into your property and secondly as a deterrent to a potential burglar.

When investing in an intruder alarm it is advisable to have it professionally installed although they can be installed manually. When enquiring into alarms do not consider using cold callers or telephone sales. If you have any concerns or queries around a potentially alarm company do not hesitate to contact the Police or Trading Standards for advice.

AUDIBLE ONLY: This will be the bells only and can either be an internal or external alarm.

REMOTELY MONITORED: Once triggered the siren will be activated and then send a signal to a central monitoring station. The station will contact those family and friends that you trust and for an additional cost may contact the Police.

When choosing an alarm these must be installed to the **BS.EN 50131** standard and will involve monitoring and service charges. Companies that are approved by The National Security Inspectorate (NSI) or the Security Systems and Alarms Inspection Board (SSAIB) can be viewed online at www.nsi.org.uk or www.ssaib.org.

If you go for a Police monitored alarm, you will need to ensure that the system is installed and maintained by a company that confirms to the ACPO security system policy.

External sirens and bells should not operate for more than 20 minutes. Excessive noise and frequent false alarms can irritate neighbours and lead to complaints.
