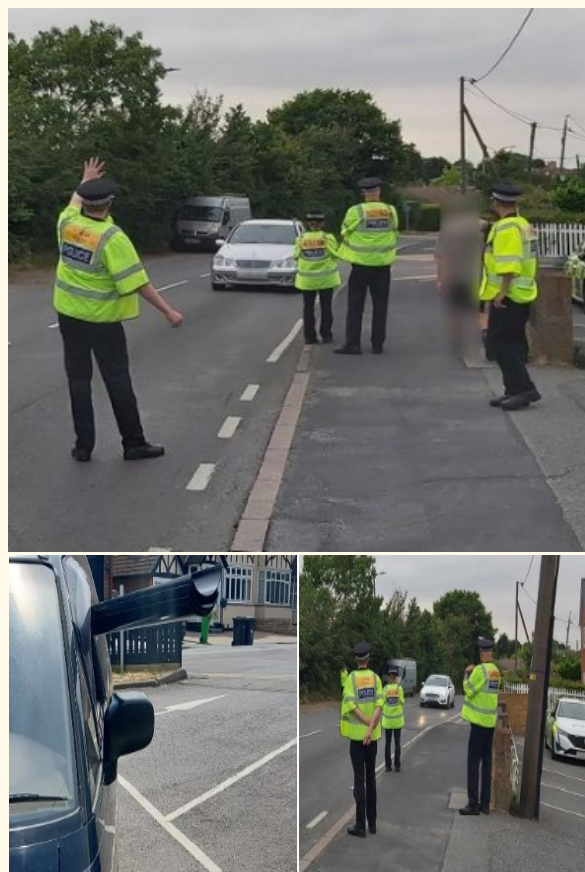
COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

In July, our Community Policing Teams, joined Road Policing and Operational Support Group to collaboratively work with focus on speed reduction and disrupting criminals intent on using our road networks.

During the collaborative approach to addressing this:

485 x checks were made, 43 x drivers were processed re speeding, 5 x Mobile Phone whist driving, 1 x Driving vehicle otherwise in accordance with a licence (DOWL), 3 x Driving in a dangerous condition, 3 x not wearing a Seat Belt, 3 x Careless Driving, 2 X tints removed and 20 x Drivers suitably advised.

Every single day we protect and serve our community, by helping people, catching criminals, and delivering justice for victims of crime.

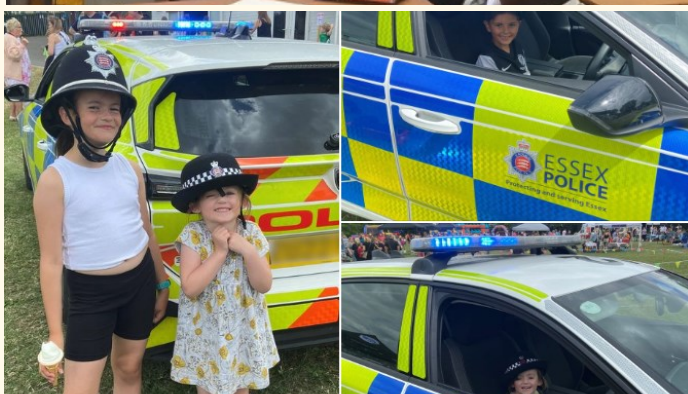
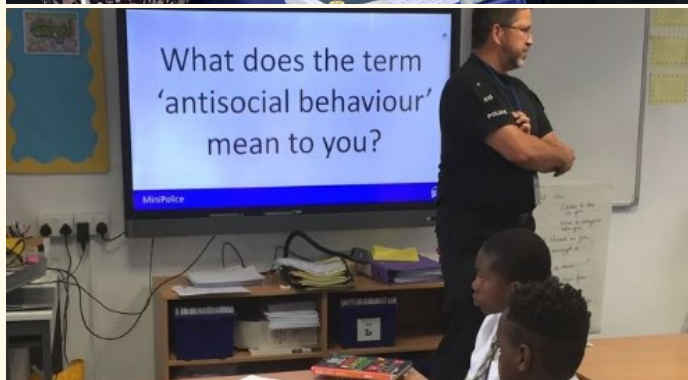

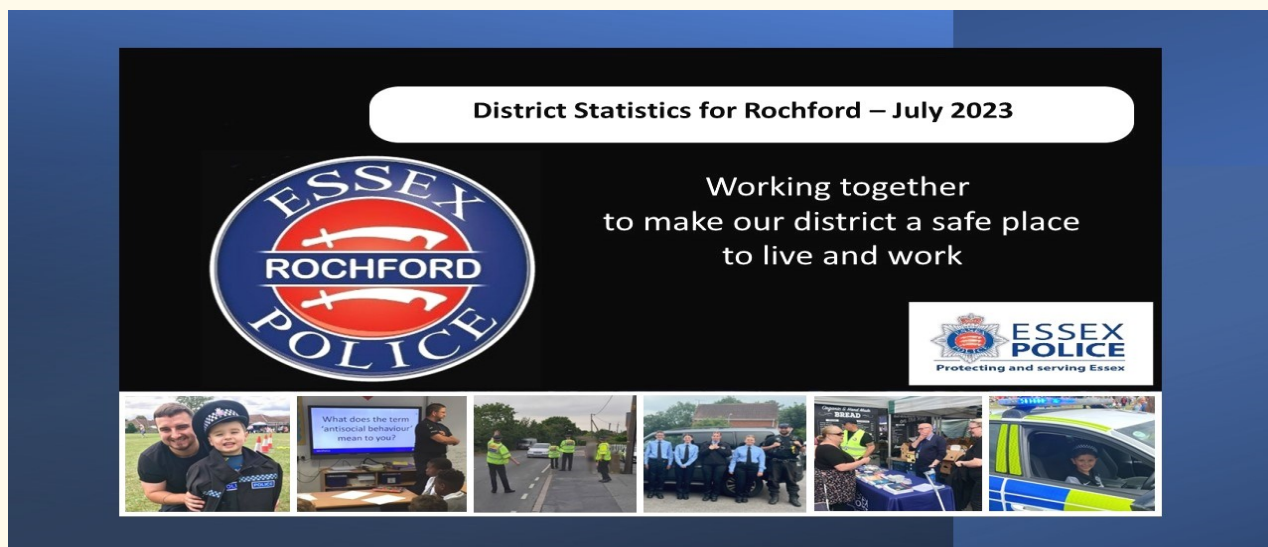

Reporting helps us to have a full understanding of what is happening and where, so we can tackle it with our partners at Rochford District Council.

DISTRICT STATISTICS



A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers have dealt with during June:

We helped to find 14 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We responded to 15 mental-health related incidents and worked with local partners to help those concerned get the help and support they needed.

We investigated 41 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 19 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 84 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 53 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We have submitted 172 pieces of intelligence which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 50 people within our district to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.

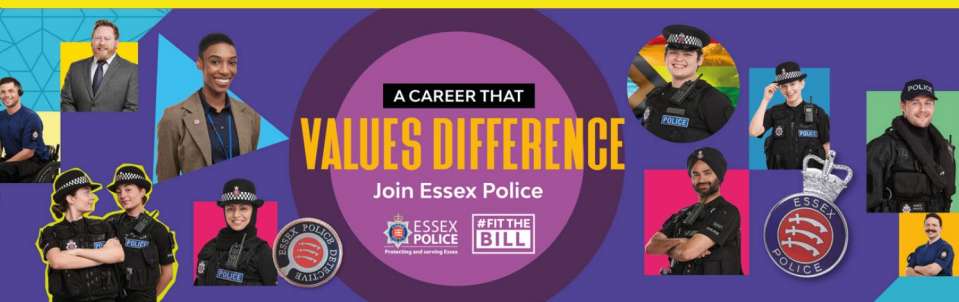
